

# Aspen Meadows Camp Rules

## General Rules:

1. An adult Priesthood holder must be present throughout the Young Women's camp.
2. After unloading equipment, limit motor vehicles parked in camp to no more than two. All others should be parked in designated overflow areas. No persons may ride in the back of pick-up trucks Please don't park or drive vehicles on the grassy area below the amphitheater.
3. ATV's, motorcycles, bicycles are not allowed beyond the lower parking area. The only exception is the vehicle assigned to the Camp Host.
4. Pets (large and small) are not allowed in the camp.
5. Campers must leave all electronic devices at home. This is a rare opportunity to feel the Spirit and commune with our Creator without the constant influence of the World. Cherish the moment.
6. Firearms and fireworks are prohibited at Aspen Meadows.
7. Cutting living trees and shrubs, and destruction of any vegetation is prohibited.
8. All garbage must be carried out with you. Cans are provided to temporarily support your garbage bags. The only local dumpster available to place your trash is at the Marion Ward in the rear parking lot. As you leave Aspen Meadows, when you reach the paved road, proceed straight ahead to the west until you reach SR32. Turn right and the Marion Ward will be on your right after a short distance. If the dumpster is full, please haul your trash back to your own ward dumpster.
9. Report any damage, vandalism, or trespassing you observe to the Camp Host. If the Camp Host is missing when security trouble arises, have an adult leader call 911 for assistance.
10. For emergency purposes, there should be at least one cell phone in each camp kept by an adult leader. When fires are allowed by the U.S. Forest Service, (ask your Camp Host on current fire restrictions), they must be limited to the designated fire pits. Fires must never be left unattended. Extinguish all fires completely before leaving them.
11. Before leaving Aspen Meadows be sure you leave it cleaner and better than you found it. If no Camp Host is present, be sure to lock all doors and the gate as you leave.

## Restrooms and Showers:

1. All campers will need flip-flops to wear when using the showers.
2. Conserve water and power by taking short (5 minute) showers.
3. Campers bring their own soap, shampoo and towels. The Camp does not provide these.
4. Do not put foreign objects in the toilets. Foreign objects are anything other than toilet paper. Special containers are provided for sanitary napkins and tampons in each restroom.
5. Before leaving Aspen Meadows, Stake Camp leaders should assure that all toilets have been cleaned, are easily flushed, and that showers and sinks have also been cleaned and sanitized.
6. Cleaning supplies are obtained from the Camp Host.
7. Stake camp leaders arrange to empty and re-line sanitary napkin containers in the bathroom as needed, and certainly at the end of the camp.

## Camp Sites:

1. When fires are allowed by the U.S. Forest Service, (ask your Camp Host on current fire restrictions), they must be limited to the designated fire pits. Fires must never be left unattended. Extinguish all fires completely before leaving them.
2. Firewood is not provided. Some deadfall may be available, but don't count on it.
3. Metal, glass and other non-combustible materials are not to be placed in the fire pits or the pavilion fireplace.
4. Tables should remain where they are in the campsites. Check with the Camp Host for availability of any additional tables if one is needed.
5. Protect tables from hot items such as pots, stoves, Dutch ovens, etc.
6. Cover the tables when doing crafts.
7. Sweep off the cement pad in the camp as you prepare to leave.

## Pavilion:

1. Do not remove tables from the pavilion. Exceptions must be approved by the Camp Host.
2. Remove ashes from the fireplace after they have cooled.
3. Clean off the tables and sweep the floor before you leave camp.
