General Guidelines

- Fires: The Oregon Department of Forestry Fire rules for the Alsea Area must be followed. At any time the fire
 danger is high, all cooking at individual campsites is to be done on contained charcoal or propane units only.
 During this time no open fires are permitted any place in the camp. NEVER LEAVE ANY CAMP FIRE
 UNATTENDED. Be positive there are no embers or hot ashes left before you leave. Please do not burn uneaten
 food, foil, or plastic materials.
- 2. **GARBAGE**: When the large dumpster is present (during YW camps) it is for refuse only. Please flatten all cardboard boxes before putting in the dumpster. DO NOT PUT HOT MATERIALS IN DUMPSTERS!! When the dumpster is not present, all campers are responsible for cleaning up campsites and taking ALL garbage, including broken glass or other hazardous materials with them when departing.
- 3. **PICNIC TABLES**: If you find it necessary to relocate any of the picnic tables, please return them to their original location. Folding tables must stay at Helaman Hall or Sariah Shelter. Please wipe tables clean after use.
- 4. **FIREARMS**, etc: *Guns or any other devices capable of launching a projectile (crossbows, bows, slings, blowguns, paint ball guns, golfing, etc)* **are strictly forbidden**. Camp Alpine is a posted NO HUNTING area. Archery is allowed at the archery range under camp certified supervision.
- 5. RAMBO LAKE: Diving is forbidden in Rambo Lake. Canoeing and swimming are permitted, but when a group is camping lifeguards are required when the lake is occupied. Life jackets are required when using the canoes. Lifeguard and two trained personnel are required anytime the zip line is used. Scouting activities must follow BSA Safety Afloat guidelines. When families are camping, parents are responsible for their own children and a Hold Harmless Agreement must be signed.
- 6. **TREE CUTTING**: Cutting of standing trees is prohibited without written authorization by the caretaker. There is cut firewood available.
- 7. **TOILETS:** Toilets are for human waste only, NO GARBAGE, Please dispose of feminine products in the provided receptacle.
- 8. **ANIMALS**: Horses, dogs, cats, or any other pets **ARE NOT ALLOWED** in the camp. If you bring them, you will be asked to take them back home.
- 9. **HOURS**: 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. are quiet hours. Have fun, but please consider other campers, and neighboring residents. No generators are permitted between 10 pm and 6 am.
- 10. VEHICLES. Personal ATV's and off-road motorcycles are not allowed in the camp. YW leaders may use ATV's on graveled roads with approval of the camp office. Personal vehicles are allowed in the camp for loading and unloading purposes. After unloading/loading, YW camp vehicles must be parked in the parking area on Nephi Lane. ABSOLUTELY NO DRIVING OR PARKING ON THE MEADOWS Any exceptions for the handicapped or others must be preapproved by camp office before arriving to camp. Mountain biking is not permitted on any of our camping trails.
- 11. ALL SERVICE PROJECTS: Please contact the Camp Alpine missionaries at 541-424-3126.
- 12. **CAMPERS/TRAILERS:** There are **two** RV spaces with electrical connections only. Camp Alpine is primarily a rustic, tent-only facility. Please respect this guideline and keep the peaceful, beautiful spirit here.
- 13. **PHONE:** There is an emergency phone located outside the nurse's station door. There is a phone also located on the front porch of the missionary's home. Emergency use only, PLEASE.
- 14. NO overnight camping inside of Helaman Hall. It is a state regulation.
