

## Camp Manapu - Helpful Information & Rules

Check in at 1:00 p.m. - Check out 11:00 a.m.

There is limited cell service: For emergency contact from parents there are two options. Sawtooth National Recreational Headquarters are at the entrance of the road to Camp Manapu.

Their hours are: Mon - Fri, 8 am to 4:30 pm. Phone number is 208-727-5000.

For extreme emergency, Blaine County Sheriff Department will dispatch an officer.

Phone number is 208-788-5555. Please use discretion in using these options.

### Rules

LDS standards must be observed while in camp which includes appropriate language and dress.

Use of tobacco, tea, coffee, alcohol and illegal drugs is not permitted.

No firearms, weapons, fireworks or explosives are allowed.

No dogs, cats, pets or horses are allowed.

No paint-balling allowed.

No graffiti in any area.

No writing, carving, spray painting or putting nails in the trees.

No tent trenching.

No motorcycles, 4-wheelers, ATV's or dirt bikes are allowed in camp.

If you do bring them to ride outside camp, please adhere to State Laws.

No playing around propane tanks.

Parking in designated areas only.

### General

Quiet time is from 10:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.

The caretakers have complete authority in all matters concerning use of the camp.

Contact the caretakers upon arriving at camp / Check out with the caretakers before leaving.

Report all accidents to caretakers and fill out an incident report.

Generator use is from 6 am to 10 pm. If night electricity is needed an additional fee of \$20 per hour is required or bring a small generator.

### Lodge

The tables and chairs are not to be taken from the lodge.

Keep the area around the lodge clean and pick up all trash.

Clean lodge thoroughly before leaving.

Put grease in trash & not down the drains.

Read health guide at [www.foodsafety.idaho.gov](http://www.foodsafety.idaho.gov) (for cooks) before coming to the camp.

### Tent Sites

Fires in fire pits only / Bring your own wood, but may use dead trees.

Pick up and clean area before leaving.

### Restrooms

Do not put anything in toilets, other than toilet paper / This includes the outhouses.

The water system is gravity flow.

Make sure tank has stopped running before flushing again to avoid plugs. "You plug / You unplug"

### Items you must provide

Camp has one stove, so you may need cooking equipment.

There is a small 5 ft. refrigerator, so you may need coolers to preserve food.

Pots, pans and all cooking utensils.

Cleaning supplies (dish soap), paper towels, trash bags (45 gal).

Hand soap, Lysol spray (it helps eliminate odors).

Matches & paper for starting fires.
