## Rules for use of Mantua Girls Home and Maple Hill Campground DO NOT DRIVE ON THE GRASS AROUND THE GIRLS HOME!! IT CAN DAMAGE THE SPRINKLERS!

No pets are permitted at Church recreation camps, even if they stay in your vehicle.

- 1. **Camp inspection**: Upon arrival, inspect the camp for cleanness, and damage, or water leaks, report problems to the camp hosts service missionaries.
- 2. **Conservation**: conserve water and electricity whenever possible.
- 3. **Fire:** Open fires are only allowed in the approved fire pits. Remember the fire danger is high most of the time, so please be careful with open flames. The "spark arrester" screen must be over the fire pits when there is a fire burning in the fire pit. You are responsible to clean out the fire pit, if you used it. Thoroughly douse the fire with water to ensure there are no live embers. Remove the burned debris from the pit, place it in garbage bags and deposit the bags in the trash bin with the rest of your garbage.
- 4. **Garbag**e: Please carry out all of your garbage. It can be placed in the large trash bin at the bottom of the hill and south of the Box Elder Campground. It is where you turn off the private home road to go west toward the hill side.
- 5. **Respect other campers**: The Mantua Girls Home building and Maple Hill Campground are two separate facilities, therefore, please do not bother the other group. ATVs are not to be ridden around the facilities.
- 6. **Supplies:** Please bring sufficient utensils, paper plates, napkins, paper towels. The cleaning supplies for the building will be provided.
- 7. **Cooking Equipment**: You will need to bring any cooking equipment, camp stove, water-containers and utensils, towels, etc. that you may need, however, there are two kitchen ranges in the Mantua Girls Home building for the people using that facility.
- 8. **The Sewer system** is the septic tank and drain field type, therefore please **DO NOT** discharge chemicals or grease into the sinks or toilets. Sanitary napkins or wet wipes

**ARE NOT** to be flushed down the toilets. Chemicals, grease or hazardous material kills the bacteria and the sewer system will become clotted and unusable.

- 9. **Conduct:** All users of the camp are required to maintain the standards of conduct as set by the LDS Church.
- 10. **Fire wood:** Do not cut any trees or the bark on the trees. Some wood may by available at the Maple Hill Campground, check with the camp hosts missionaries.
- 11. **Private Property**: Even through the camp is on private property, all occupants are subject to any local, state, and federal land use restrictions. This includes fire restrictions, water conservation, or any other restrictions in effect. (Most years there is a fire restriction after the middle or the end of July.)
- 12. Clean-up Required: A detailed clean-up checklist will be posted to help with the clean-up. Please clean up after yourselves. If the site is not clean, a fee of fifty dollars will be charged to your group. Also, your group may be charged for any damage done to any of the facilities.
- 13. **Safety:** No weapons of any kind are allowed in the area including guns, bows and arrows, sling shots, paint ball and air soft guns.
- 14. The Green Tables at the Maple Hill Campground are vinyl coated. Please do not cook or place hot items on the table because the vinyl will melt.
- 15. Please do not pitch tents on the grass around the Girls Home. The sprinklers come on in the middle of the night. If tents are on the grass you will be asked to remove them.

DO NOT DRIVE ON THE GRASS AROUND THE GIRLS HOME! You can drive on, park on, and put up tents on the WEEDY area on the same level area as the volleyball court east of the Girls Home. There are NO sprinklers in this area.
