

GUEST INFORMATION

1. ARRIVAL

1. CHECK IN/ CHECK OUT

- i. Girls Camp check in time 9:00am
- ii. Check in time is 1:00 PM on the day of arrival. Check out time is 12:00 Noon on the day of departure, except Saturday. (Check-out time on Saturday is 10:00 PM.)

2. Young Women's Groups and Friday Evening Guests will be met at the gate by Missionaries that will direct them to their camps and to parking areas for unloading and for final parking. These groups will be announced on the radios. At this time the missionary over your campsite will be aware that you have arrived

2. CAMP NOTES:

OWNERSHIP – Mutual Dell Camp is a non-profit facility that has been established by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints for use by Young Women, church groups, other non-profit groups, and families. Please help us protect the pristine beauty of the camp and help keep costs down by being responsible campers and leaving everything better than you found it.

CAMP RULES

General

1. Please be advised that Mutual Dell Youth Camps, Confidence Courses, and the Forest Amphitheatre are built into the side of a Mountain. **There is no parking close to these camps and it is necessary for campers and leaders to hike up into these areas.** For any physically challenged girls, we have 3 campsite designated for their use: PantyWaist Pocket, Boogyman Hollow, and Bears Lair and most of the family camps. You will need to help in transporting the physically challenged. Please be aware it is the wards responsibility to transfer.
2. An adequate number of adult priesthood leaders should be at camp at all times to assist with security, participate in camp activities as needed, and give blessings when appropriate. (2 minimum)
3. NO PETS- No dogs or animals of any kind are allowed at Mutual Dell Camp.
4. No paint balls or air soft guns may be used, water balloons may be used if there is no sign of balloon matter anywhere (fire arms are strictly prohibited).

5. Church dress standards will be observed at all times. No pants above the knee. Be prepared for cool weather. Bring rain gear, sturdy shoes, and hiking gear.

Camp Safety

1. **NEVER HIKE ALONE!** The buddy system is the standard for Mutual Dell. And leaders are required to do an accountability check several times a day for all their leaders and youth. Family and Ward groups are responsible for the safety of children and for knowing the location where their young people are.
2. Please stay on established trails.
3. Fires must be contained in approved fire pits. Do not leave fires unattended. Extinguish fires by spreading the embers to the side of the pit and sprinkling them with water. Never use soil to put the fire out

Camp Maintenance

1. **PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THERE ARE NO DUMPSTERS AT MUTUAL DELL. ALL YOU TRASH MUST BE REMOVED DAILY.** We have very creative critters that feel that your trash is their smorgasbord will gladly spread your trash all over your camp. Girls Camps must arrange for the trash to be removed daily.
2. Please leave your campsites better than you find it.
3. BE BEAR AWARE! Mutual Dell Camp is in Bear Country. Bear sightings are rare. Keep all food stored properly in a closed container, and out of tents.
4. **If you use a bathroom it is your responsibility to clean it** (toilets, showers, sink, floors, windows, etc.). We realize that there are other groups that may be using the same facilities. They have been instructed also to clean the same bathrooms. If each group takes ownership of cleaning these bathrooms we can be assured they will be clean. We suggest cleaning assignments should be determined by the groups using the facilities. We are requesting that **each bathroom is cleaned twice a day.** Cleaning supplies are provided.
5. Each Pavilion floor must be swept off and sprayed off with water before you leave.
6. Tables must be cleaned and free of craft residue
7. If you use the ball field, confidence courses, trails or zipline, **please patrol for trash**-water bottles, napkins, candy wrappers etc. and take back to your camp for disposal. Pick up all trash very small to extra large
8. Feel free to use the **BBQ grills**-please leave them free of grease residue and use the wire brush to remove BBQ debris. We suggest that these be used on the dirt. This will make it easier for you to clean up the grease. These will be checked by the Camp Host before you are cleared to leave camp.

9. Clean and/or wash down all surfaces (floors, tables, cabinets, counter tops, grills, etc.) of the pavilions prior to departure. Make sure that all paper, plastic, balloons, cans, glass, and garbage is picked up and removed from camp. Obtain a check-out form from the camp hosts and have them sign the form before departure.
10. COOKING - Use approved fire rings or kitchens to do all cooking. Do all Dutch-oven cooking in approved fire pits. Do not set hot Dutch ovens on grassy areas! Dispose of all unused food properly (place in garbage bags and take with you). Do not dump unused food on the ground!

Camp Activities

1. Campers need **to be on time for their scheduled activities**. If you arrive late your time on that activity will be cut short. We have the missionaries tightly scheduled and the next group will be waiting for their turn. Girls Camp Leaders, please turn in your schedule of activities 2 weeks prior to your arrival so that we can have the missionaries available to assist your activities.
2. **We need 5 leaders to run the zipline**, without them, we cannot operate the Zip Line.
3. **Closed Toed Shoes** -- Everyone using the zipline must have closed toed shoes, no exceptions. Trading shoes is ok.
4. **Confidence Courses use must be scheduled**. Missionary supervision is required. For Girls Camp we offer training for the YW leaders so they will be able to do the reflection portion of the activity.
