
Integrating Preach My Gospel into Religion 130

SEMINARIES AND INSTITUTES OF RELIGION

Purpose

Better prepare potential missionaries enrolled in Religion 130 to teach core doctrines found in chapter 3 of *Preach My Gospel*.

President Thomas S. Monson recently encouraged those preparing for missions: "Where such is available, participate in seminary or institute. Familiarize yourself with the missionary handbook *Preach My Gospel*" ("As We Meet Together Again," *Ensign*, Nov. 2010, 6).

Elder L. Tom Perry of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles stated: "Don't neglect the opportunity of attending seminary and institute classes. . . . Study from *Preach My Gospel*, emphasizing the basic doctrines taught in chapter 3. Each time you are asked to speak in church or to teach a family home evening lesson, focus on these basic doctrines" ("Raising the Bar," *Ensign*, Nov. 2007, 48).

Elder Richard G. Scott of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles taught: "There is a special course in the institute program and at the three Brigham Young Universities that can prepare you for missionary service. It is founded in the principles contained in *Preach My Gospel* and goes hand-in-hand with that powerful resource. It will give you a head start for when you are called to serve" ("Now Is the Time to Serve a Mission!" *Ensign*, May 2006, 88).

How to Achieve the Purpose

Provide weekly opportunities in the Missionary Preparation course (Religion 130) for students to teach core doctrines and principles found in chapter 3 of *Preach My Gospel*.

Preach My Gospel Doctrines for Students to Practice Teaching

The Missionary Department identified the following doctrines as the most essential for prospective missionaries to understand and become proficient in teaching:

How to Integrate Preach My Gospel Doctrines into the Existing Course

Each of the lessons currently found in Religion 130 have teaching opportunities for students already built into the curriculum. The identified *Preach My Gospel* principles could be used as replacement or enhancement activities for those already found in the current teacher manual for the course.

Some of the ways teachers might implement student teaching of *Preach My Gospel* doctrines include:

- The teacher could assign each prospective missionary to come to each class prepared to teach a 3–5 minute lesson (following the format found in the Religion 130, *Missionary Preparation Student Manual*, pp. 44–45) centered on one of the doctrines found in chapter 3 of *Preach My Gospel*.
- The teacher could devote time at the beginning or end of each class for practice teaching.
- One student could model his or her prepared lesson in front of the entire class, followed by a brief discussion including evaluation of the lesson, positive feedback, and suggestions.
- The teacher could assign students to work in pairs or small groups as they teach their lessons to a partner or 3 or 4 other students. The teacher should follow this with a question and answer session to discuss concerns, clarify doctrines, and answer any questions students may have.

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The following chart illustrates one possible schedule for student teaching:
