



Family History

Family pictures are a great way to start our family history. Scan one of your family pictures, and upload it to FamilySearch.org.




Doing family history allows you to \boldsymbol{help} your ancestors.

Ask an adult to help you **find** a name on your family tree that needs temple work done.




Ask someone in your family to tell you about his or her sealing, write his or her story down, and add it to FamilySearch.org




Families can be together forever because of **temple** ordinances.

Find your way from your house to the temple.






Spending time with family members can help you **learn** about your family history.

The temple is our Heavenly Father's house. You make sacred covenants with Heavenly Father there for yourself, and then you help your ancestors make those covenants. Ask your Primary teacher how you can prepare to go to the temple someday.




When you get to know your family, you learn more about yourself. Ask your mom and dad to show you pictures of them when they were children.

Match an ancestor to the part of the world he or she came from.



Your ancestors may have come from many different places. Ask an aunt or uncle where your ancestors came from.

Help the family name **find** its way to the temple through the maze.



Learn about a family member, enter his or her information into FamilySearch, and reserve the name for temple work. Then if you are old enough and it is possible, attend the temple to do his or her work.



In the temple, you can do baptisms for the dead. Ask a family member or friend to tell you how he or she felt the first time he or she visited the temple.

Temples can be found all around the world. Ask an adult in your family to take you to visit a temple.






Great blessings come from attending the temple to help our ancestors. Find out which temple is closest to you.





Your ancestors were once children like **you**.

Ask a grown-up you know which temple he or she visited first.



You can go to the temple and do baptisms for the dead when you are 12 years old. Plan a trip to the temple with your family when you turn 12. Prepare now so you can take family names with you when you go.



Visiting cemeteries is a good way to start learning about your ancestors. Visit a cemetery to find out when someone in your family was born and and passed away. Check FamilySearch.org to see if his or her name is on your family tree.
