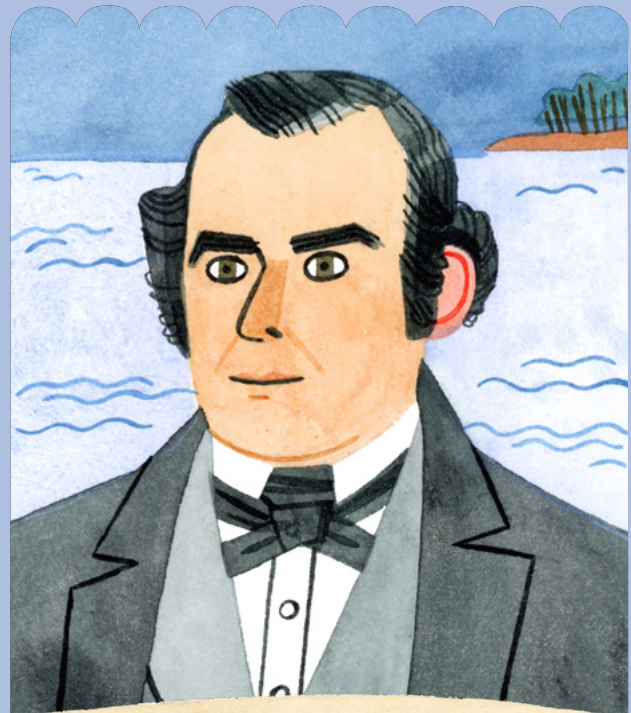
- Liin ekar kobatok ilo Kabuñ in ilo Connecticut, USA.
