“[I] wish to encourage in our children a love . . . for all things beautiful.”

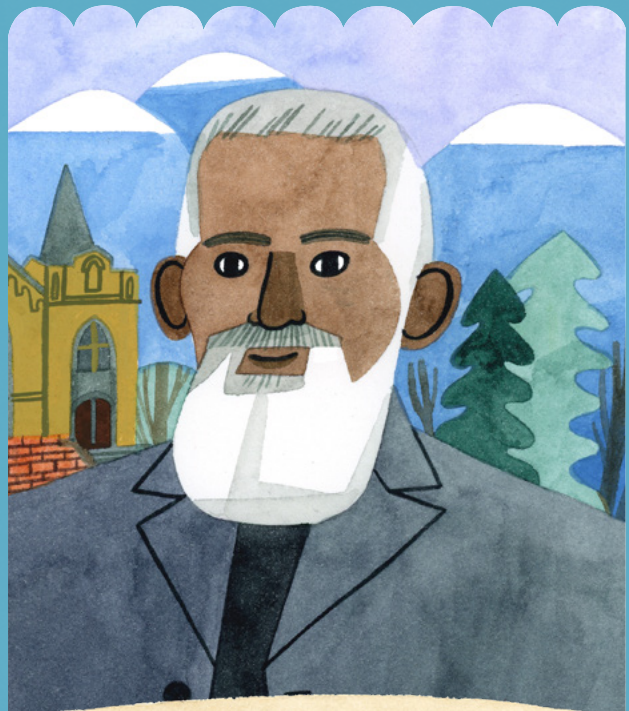
- Her family joined the Church when she was six years old.
- She crossed the plains with her little siblings and took care of them alone.
- With the prophet’s approval, she started the very first Primary.
- She supported giving women the right to vote.

- He was baptized at age 13. He wanted to travel to be with the Saints, but he couldn’t because he was enslaved.
- Slavery finally ended in the United States 21 years later. He went to Utah with his family.
- He helped clean the chapel every week.
- He shared his testimony often and was faithful all his life.
